# 2. TERMITES CONTROL IN AGRICULTURE FIELD:

Use 12.5-25 ml/dounm as follows:

- Apply with full coverage over soil surface before planting, ploughing and mixing the treated soil in depth 5-10 cm.
- Spray over planting lines after seeding, then full coverage with soil over the treated seeds.

# COMPATIBILITY:

Compatible with most pesticides, but compatibility test is recommended before spraying.
